- Refunds will be made ONLY if session has been filled or cancelled, and refunds will be mailed in late August 2013.
- Participants should wear comfortable shoes and clothing for all outdoor sessions. Sandals, flip-flops, or open-toed shoes of
  any kind are not acceptable for outdoor activities and participant may not be allowed to participate if such footwear is
  worn.
- For all trips and activities, Forsyth County 4-H, its staff and volunteers, **are not responsible** for sunburn or insect bites and **will not** administer either sunscreen or insect repellant. Parent/Guardian is responsible for applying these protective agents.
- All events operate under the **4-H Code of Conduct and Disciplinary Procedure** which is a condition of participation in 4-H events and activities. This information can be found on our website on the "Forms" page see link below.
- After you register, you will be sent a packet of 4-H forms to complete, which include a Medical Release form that must be notarized, and a 4-H Enrollment form. Your child will not be allowed to participate without all forms being completed. 




